
No Cavities, No Problems? Why Implant Care Still Matters

Antibacterial mouthwash reduces bacterial growth, lowering infection risks. Consistent routines prevent plaque buildup, safeguarding both implants and adjacent natural teeth.

Regular dental visits allow professionals to detect early signs of trouble. Dentists assess gum health, implant stability, and bone density during check-ups. Professional cleanings target hardened tartar that home brushing can't address, particularly around the implant's base.
