Why Should I Remove My Wisdom Teeth?



So your dentist suggests you extract your wisdom teeth and you are wondering whether or not to extract. You are not the one who is hesitating to remove the wisdom teeth. Is wisdom teeth extraction necessary? – This is one of the most common questions every patient asks when they are asked to extract their third molars. While it is not necessary to have them removed, you must pull them out if they are problematic. However, the dentist is the right person to determine whether you can have them or not.

Not everybody removes their wisdom teeth. You can have them if they have developed in the right position without affecting the adjacent teeth and are healthy. However, this is not the case for all. Most of the wisdom teeth becomes impacted and requires extraction. The **wisdom teeth removal Sydney** is actually a preventive procedure to avoid dental problems and save the adjacent teeth.

What are wisdom teeth?

Wisdom teeth are the last set of molars to emerge in late twenties. While some may have all four wisdom teeth, others may have one or two or even don't develop at all. Since our jaw is small, often wisdom teeth don't get enough space to grow properly like other teeth. That is why they cause problems. Yes, an erupting wisdom tooth can grow at various angles in the jaw, troubling other teeth. When they don't get sufficient space to erupt in, they get trapped under the gum and become impacted. An impacted wisdom tooth can cause a lot of dental problems.

Why are wisdom teeth removed?

The most common problems caused by a wisdom tooth are:

• **Pericoronitis** – It is an Infection of the gum tissues around a wisdom tooth. Pericoronitis occurs in about 60% patients. If left untreated, it can lead to tooth loss. It is one of the significant reasons why dental professionals recommend **cheap wisdom teeth removal Sydney**. The infection can be severe and it causes pain and swelling.

- **Dental Decay** This is one of the significant reasons why wisdom teeth are removed. Dental decay can occur in the wisdom tooth or to the nearby tooth. This condition can cause tooth sensitivity and pain and inflammation of the roots, causing immediate problems until tooth decay affects the nerve of a tooth and then an abscess can form.
- **Gum disease** Wisdom teeth can contribute to gum disease to other teeth. You may not find any signs of gum disease but still can trouble you. By the time you realize that your teeth have gum disease, the infection would have been progressed, causing tooth loss.
- Cyst Though this condition occurs in less than 1% patients, it can be problematic if left untreated.
